

## Condolence Note on the sad demise of Prof. Marghoob Banhali

The faculty and research scholars of Markaz-i Noor, Centre for Shaikh-ul Aalam Studies (CSAS), University of Kashmir offers their sincere condolences on the sad demise of Prof. Marghoob Banhali, Former Head, Department of Kashmiri, University of Kashmir, who passed away on 27<sup>th</sup> April 2021 / 14<sup>th</sup> Ramadhan, 1442 at his Srinagar residence. Prof. Marghoob was a



renowned scholar and litterateur, who dedicated his entire life towards literary and scholarly pursuits. During his long association with Kashmir University spanning over thirty years, he headed the Department of Kashmiri, besides also serving the Department of Persian and Central Asian Studies. He has authored more than 40 books comprising poems, prose, translation and critical analysis in Kashmiri, Urdu and English. For his immense literary contribution, he won numerous awards, including the Sahitya Akademi Award for Kashmiri literature in 1979 for his collection of poetry – Partavistan.

Prof. Marghoob had an abiding association with the Centre for Shaikh-ul Aalam Studies (CSAS) right from its inception in 1998. His extraordinary ability to popularise Hazrat Shaikh-ul Aalam <sup>(RA)</sup> is note worthy and unprecedented. He was actively involved in the academic pursuits of our centre. He translated the 16th century Noor Namah of Baba Naseeb-ud-Din Ghazi <sup>(RA)</sup> into Urdu, which was eventually published by the Centre. His contribution to Shaikh-ul Aalam has been a source of inspiration for both scholars and faculty at centre.
